Take a look through the hospital viewing window as veterinary staff carry out examinations (when underway) and administer treatment to koala inpatients.

All pathways and elevated viewing platforms are easily accessible designed for all ages and abilities. It is recommended that you wear comfortable walking shoes, a hat and sunscreen for sun protection and drink plenty of water to remain hydrated.
